

Case Summary

Anna was a 42 year old mother of one
She met the perpetrator in 2014 and was living in Peterborough having moved from Lithuania
He had a history of abuse against women

•She was killed 2015, exact date unknown.

•She had suffered a brutal attack before her body was dismembered He was found guilty of murder, sentenced to life with minimum 20 years in prison

<u>Key Themes</u>

- •Lithuanian Victim and perpetrator.
 - Serial Perpetrator
- Alcohol dependent and mental health issues.
- •Living in multi-occupancy address and frequently moved.
 - •Perpetrator alcohol dependant.
 - •Perpetrator had a criminal record.
 - •Incorrect spelling of names.

The purpose of Domestic Homicide Review (DHR) is

- •Identify whether there are lessons to be learned about the way in which local professionals and agencies worked together to safeguard.
 - •Suggest changes and identify good practice.
- •Establish whether agencies have appropriate policies and procedures to respond to domestic abuse.

RECOMMENDATIONS

EU wide information exchange between support agencies when vulnerable person moves country.

Increased training for staff to recognise potential signs of DA.

Risk assessment to be the same across organisations.

Campaign around raising awareness for DA.

Staff awareness regarding procedures around raising adult safeguarding concerns and are aware of key components of The Care Act 2014.

Recording correct names, dob and other information and individuals to be asked key questions to verify identity.

Communication strategy involving communities, private landlords, voluntary groups, employers and employment agencies around DA.
