

YOUNG VICTIMS OF CRIME

Time4u talking therapies is delivered by Embrace Child Victims of Crime (CVoC), a national registered charity.

Time4u is a counselling and psycho-therapy service for young people aged 13 - 19 years (and up to 24 years with additional needs) who have been affected by domestic abuse or sexual violence. This includes young people who have witnessed, or have been affected by, violence in their home.

Time4u offers the opportunity for young people to talk to someone who is trained to listen carefully and not judge. Sometimes it's easier and helpful to talk with someone who doesn't already know the young person or their family.

The therapist will listen to what is said and help the young person find ways to move forward – without telling them what to do.

WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

To be referred to the service, young people will be aged between 13 -19 years (up to 24 with additional needs) and:

- **have been a victim of, or witness to domestic abuse and/ or sexual violence**
- **be safe from the offender**
- **be able to make an informed choice about therapy and what it might offer them at this stage**

Time4u is a community-based service, committed to seeing young people at a convenient time and location for them.

HOW TO MAKE A REFERRAL

Visit the Time4u website on:
www.embracecvoc.org.uk
to complete a Time4u referral form
and submit it online.

Once the referral is received
Time4u staff will make contact
with the parent/carers as soon
as possible, usually within three
working days.

An assessment will be arranged
and carried out at a suitable
location.

Following the assessment, if the
young person wishes to embark on
counselling, they will be matched
with a therapist with the skills and
experience to meet their needs.
